Edgar Allan Poe

Edgar Allan Poe is one of the most widely read and influential authors in the world. He is also one of the most fascinating and mysterious figures in literary history. Over a hundred and fifty years after his untimely death, there is as much interest in the man as in his work. Generations have been both terrified by his dark, strange tales, and curious about the seemingly tortured mind that created them.

Poe is the inventor of the detective fiction genre, explored elements of science fiction, but is universally known for his ground-breaking stories of the macabre. And perhaps most famous for the opening line in *The Raven*, "Once upon a midnight dreary, while I pondered weak and weary..." Successful writers from H.P. Lovecraft to Stephen King have acknowledged his primary influence on their work. Poe's tales were so dark and frightening they fundamentally changed literature and pop culture.

What drove Edgar Allan Poe to explore such depths of psychological horror? The public's interest in the turbulent, troubled life of his has never dimmed. His biography provides a host of tantalizing mysteries that might explain his morbid writings. The addiction to drink and hallucinogenic drugs. The tragic death of his one true love. The bizarre, final days of his life are shrouded in mystery and remain a source of dark fascination. Lesser known, but just as true, is another mystery early in his life. Poe is remembered to history as a pallid, haunted figure, but long before that he was a bright and distinguished West Point cadet. The events surrounding his sudden discharge have never been explained.

Here is where our story is set. In *Raven's Hollow*, Poe becomes the central character of an imaginative Gothic horror that delves into the origins of his dark fiction and fractured psyche. This is the fantastic tale of how Poe became Poe.

The Story

In 1830, young Edgar Allan Poe was admitted to the prestigious Military Academy at West Point, where he distinguished himself as 'Best Cadet.'

A few months later he was mysteriously discharged and left the institution without explanation.

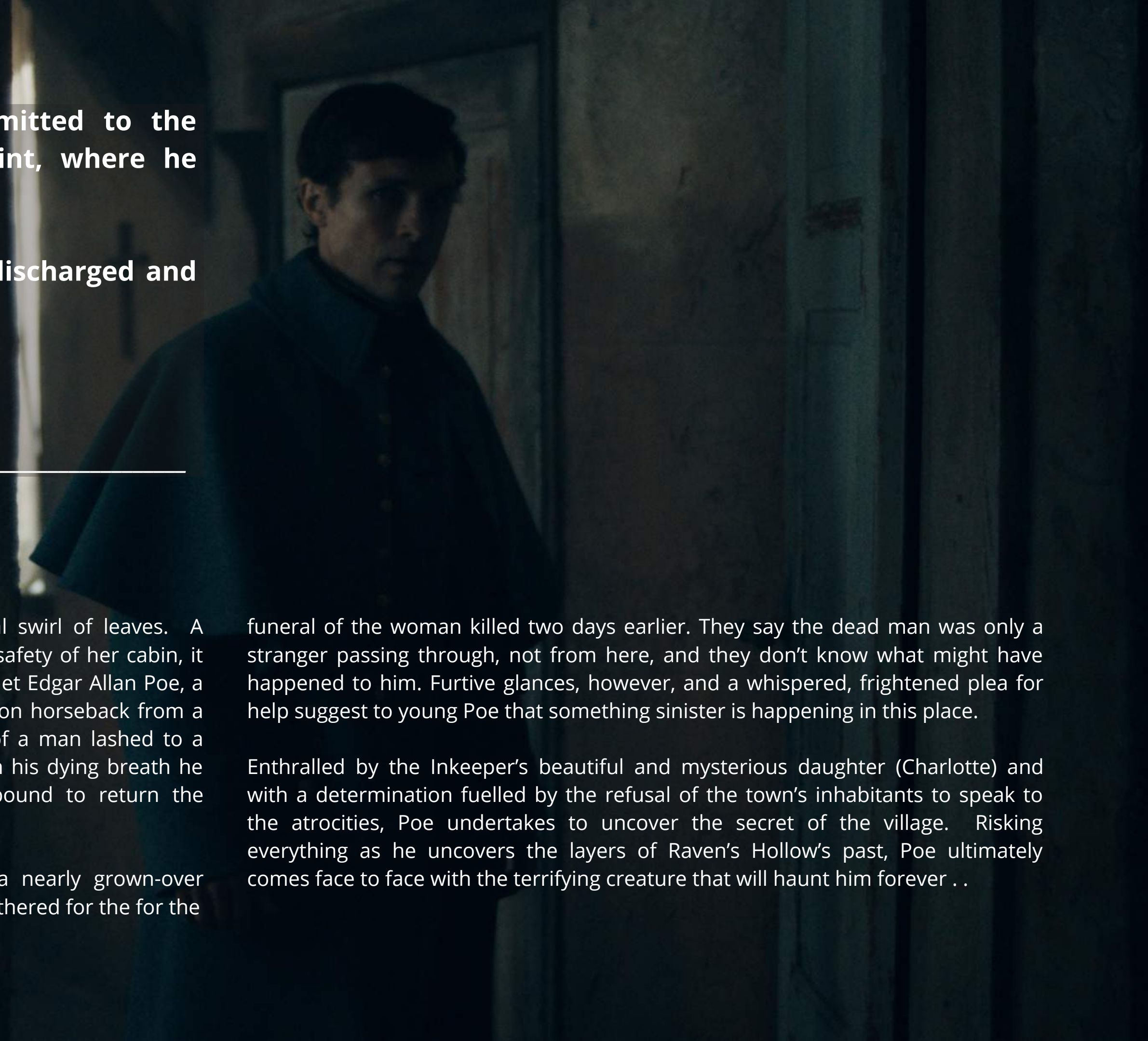
This is what happened . . .

Fall, 1830. A woman hurries home at dusk in an unnatural swirl of leaves. A creature hidden in the woods follows her. That night, in the safety of her cabin, it appears and savagely kills her. Two days later West Point Cadet Edgar Allan Poe, a handsome, serious young man, is leading four cadets home on horseback from a training exercise when they come upon the horrific scene of a man lashed to a wooden rack on a hillside, his body viciously torn open. With his dying breath he utters "Raven." Assuming it's his home, they are honor bound to return the murdered man.

Following a wooded trail, Poe and his men come upon a nearly grown-over cemetery where some locals – guarded, quiet people - have gathered for the for the

funeral of the woman killed two days earlier. They say the dead man was only a stranger passing through, not from here, and they don't know what might have happened to him. Furtive glances, however, and a whispered, frightened plea for help suggest to young Poe that something sinister is happening in this place.

Enthralled by the Inkeeper's beautiful and mysterious daughter (Charlotte) and with a determination fuelled by the refusal of the town's inhabitants to speak to the atrocities, Poe undertakes to uncover the secret of the village. Risking everything as he uncovers the layers of Raven's Hollow's past, Poe ultimately comes face to face with the terrifying creature that will haunt him forever . .

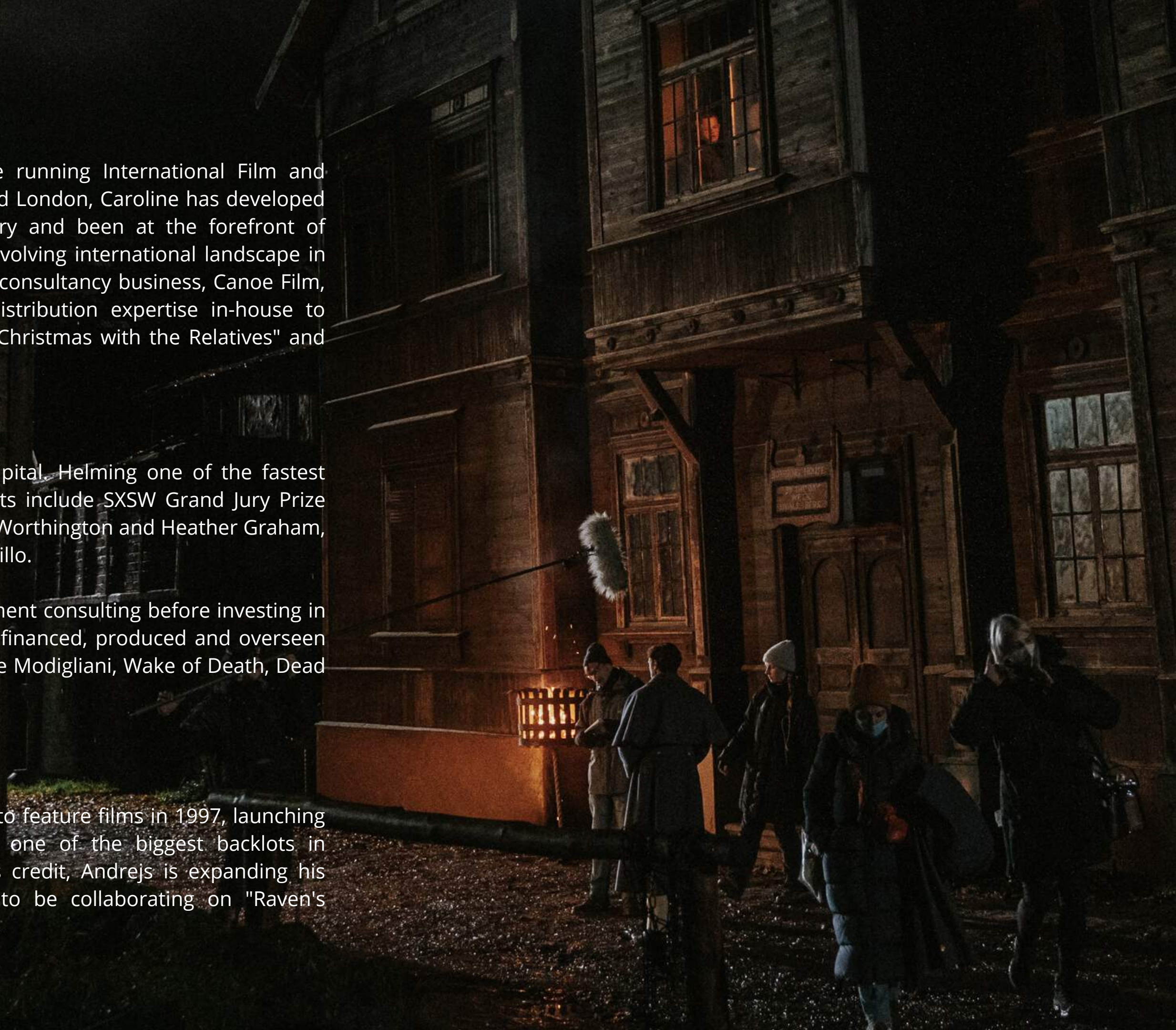
Todd Lundbohm and Mark Andrews, 828 Productions

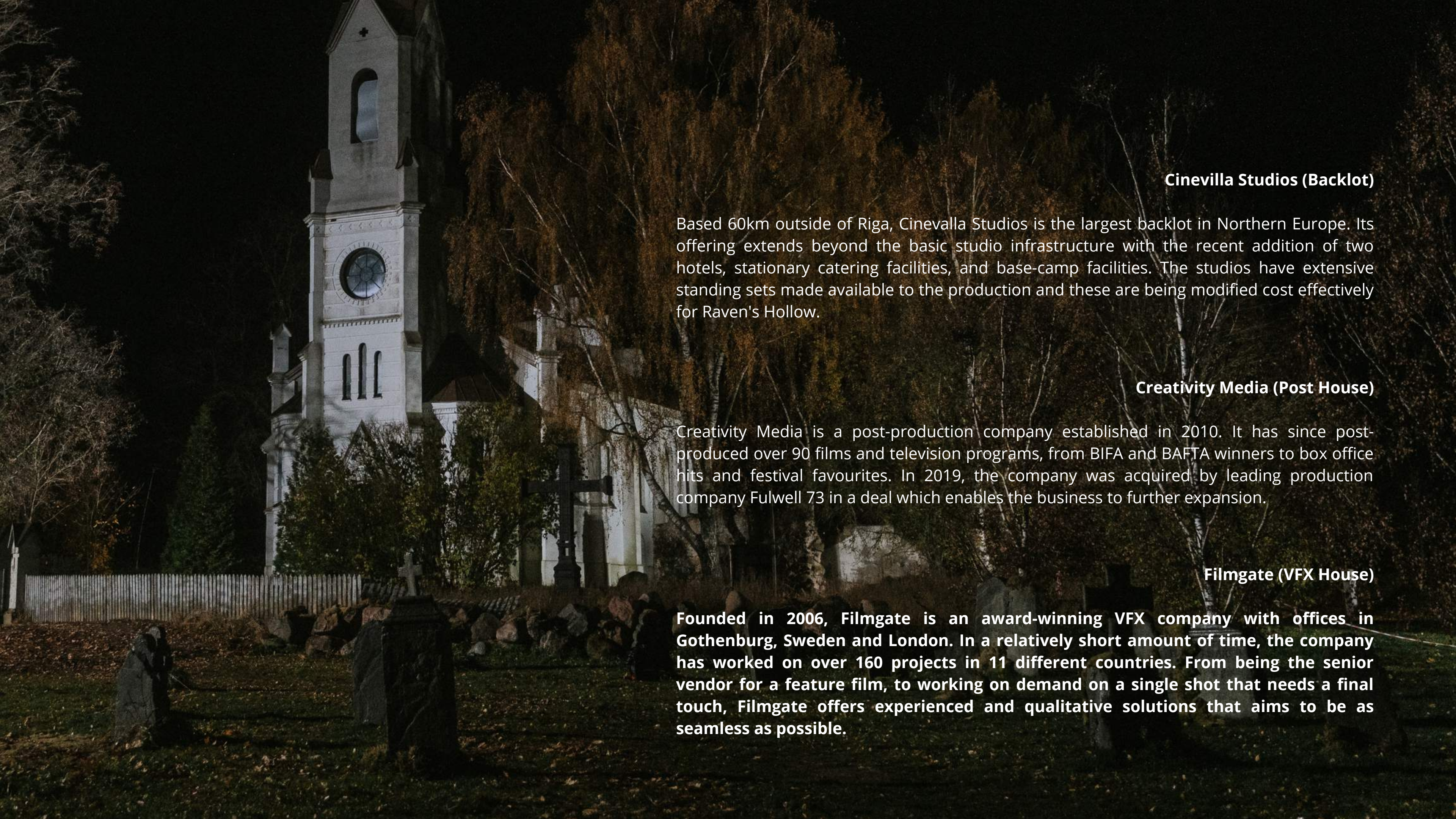

CHARLOTTE

Unless you need a hot meal and a room. (ignoring her mother's look) We keep the boarding house in town.

INGRAM

Good day to you all.



15 INT. BOARDING HOUSE - GROUND FLOOR - A FEW
MINUTES LATER


Charlotte opens a GUEST BOOK on the counter. All

Your scars. What made them?

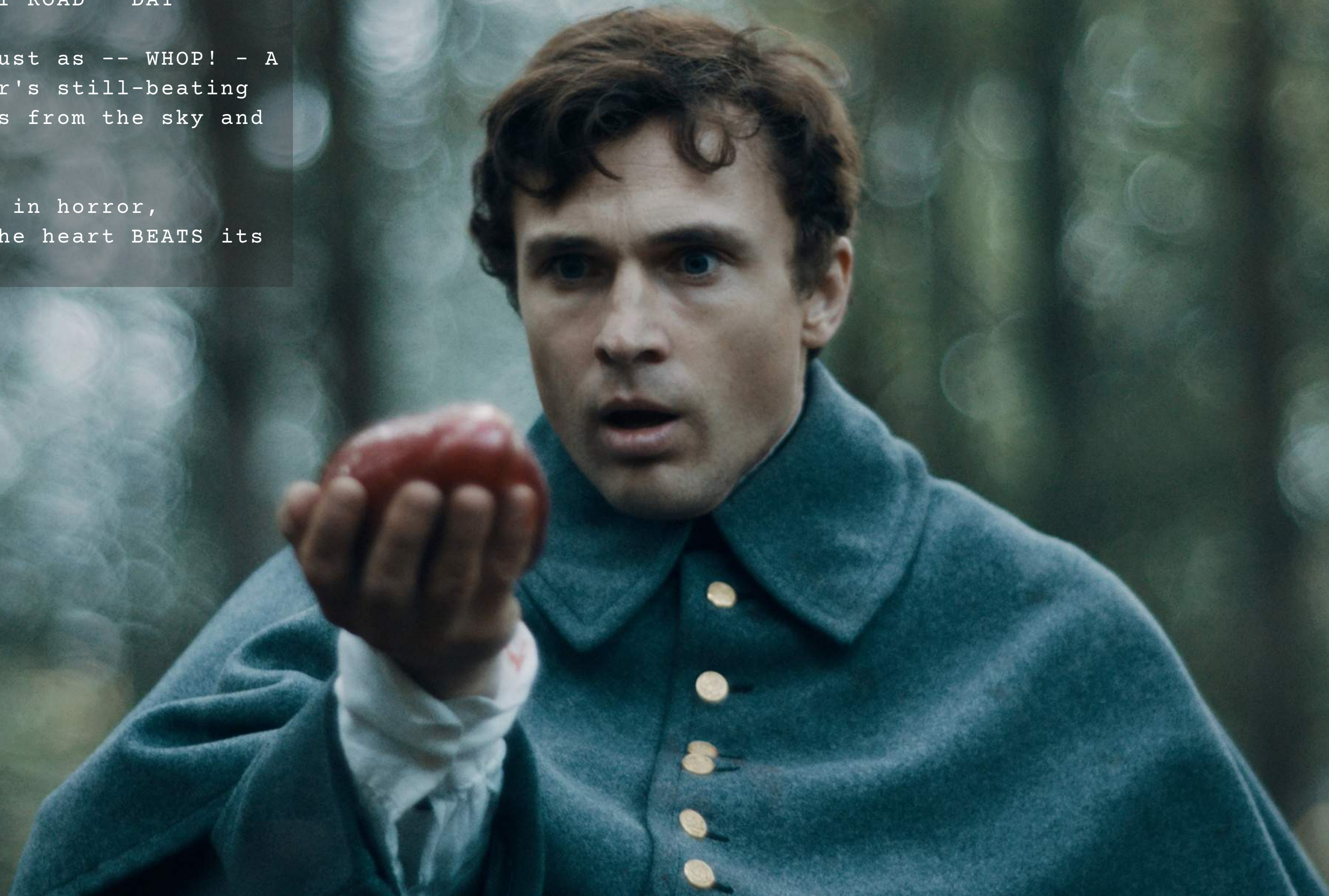
Old Clay's eyes seem to clear, the question reaching him.
